

#### The Options Form

- The Options Form is digital and will be live from Friday 8 March
- The Options Form can be accessed via the QR code on page 13 of the Options Booklet

- Students can only submit one Options Form, so must consider their choices very carefully

## Subjects

#### Compulsory Subjects

There are **examined** subjects which everyone must take:

- English Language and English Literature (two GCSEs)
- Mathematics (one GCSE)
- Combined Science (or Triple Science)

There are also **non-examined** courses which everyone must study:

- Physical Education
- Religion, Philosophy and Ethics
- iGEN (Personal, Social, Health & Citizenship Education)

#### Options Subjects

Students must choose **four** Optional Subjects in total, one from each of the four Options Blocks.

Students cannot select the same subject twice.

Option Blocks A, B and C subjects are taught for 5 hours per fortnight.

Block D subjects are taught for 4 hours per fortnight.

Graded on 9 to 1

Focus on knowledge, application and understanding

All or the majority of the assessment takes place at the end of the course

All or the majority of assessment is by exam

Grading is Distinction\* to Pass


A mix of practical and theoretical learning

Majority of the assessment is by ongoing coursework, but may include an exam



#### What is the EBacc?

The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) is a set of GCSE subjects that, when taken together, may add further weight to applications for Higher Education, especially Russell Group universities.

Subjects are taken in a combination of English, Mathematics, Science (including Computer Science), Geography or History, and Spanish.


